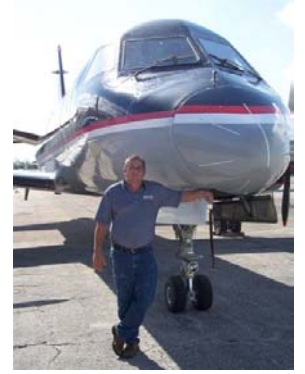
CFAM ADDS THE SAAB 340A

In the spring of 2005, Central Florida Air Maintenance expanded their capabilities to include the SAAB 340A. Five CFAM Technicians successfully completed the Pan Am Academy SAAB 340 aircraft and General Electric CT7 maintenance training courses. Recently a team of CFAM and Express One employees worked with the Telford Group to return four SAAB 340 aircraft to



service. Two of the aircraft were moved to CFAM's Sanford base to undergo further modifications and TAWS installation. The 30-passenger airliners are slated to enter the charter market with Lynx Air in Fort

Lauderdale. The addition of the SAAB 340 and the GE CT7 engines gives CFAM their initial experience in the "airliner" market. "Dave Knight has been instrumental in developing the SAAB program and upgrading the CFAM capabilities," adds Ron Gray, CFAM President. CFAM will continue to grow and add capabilities.
